From the Desk of the Town Manager

Calumet Avenue

By the time this newsletter reaches your mailbox, a number of new construction projects will be underway. The old fence along Calumet Ave has started coming down and the new precast cement fence is being installed from Main Street to north of 213th. We have made some changes to the existing design to soften the tunnel effect of the old fence. The new fence will have a textured look that will complement the stone pillars that will also be installed. The fence design, called Chiselcrete is a precast concrete product, manufactured in Texas and installed by local vendor, Fence Masters. The project will take several months to complete. After the fence is installed we will fill in the gap sidewalk along the west side. Landscaping will be installed at a later date. This project is funded by the Redevelopment Commission. Motorists will experience moving lane closures to protect the workers. Please be aware and drive carefully.

Road resurfacing will begin this month on Calumet Ave. from RT. 30 to the bridge north of 213th and the intersection approaches at 213th. This \$460,000 project is funded by Dyer's Tax Increment Revenue and a 2016 Community Crossing Grant from the State of Indiana. The section north of 213th on Calumet Ave will be improved later this year after the fence project is completed. The contractor for both projects is Walsh & Kelly.

Sheffield Avenue

We are anticipating final approval from the State of Indiana that will allow the Town to install the Quiet Zone at Sheffield and the CSX RR crossing. Once this is received we can complete the approach work as soon as possible. Walsh & Kelly will complete this work.

The Town will be applying for State funds to assist us with additional improvements to Sheffield Avenue under the Community Crossing Matching Grant Program. Improvements will include resurfacing and intersection improvements. We are meeting with the Lake County Highway Department on the reconstruction of the bridge at Hart Ditch. We anticipate construction in 2018.

Other Utility Projects

The rehabilitation and painting of the Sandy Ridge Elevated Tank is underway and will be completed by mid-summer.

The Sanitary Board has several projects underway throughout the system as well as at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The Board is beginning the process to sell \$2.7 million in bonds to undertake a series of projects, primarily at the WWTP. We will discuss these improvements in future articles.

The Stormwater Board has authorized design work for the long awaited Berens Monaldi project and a comprehensive study of the Northgate Subdivision storm water issues.

The proper maintenance of all the utilities assets is critical to systems performance. These improvements are a part of the rate structure of all the utilities.

Soccer I & II- Designed for beginner and intermediate players, this camp focuses on dribbling, passing, shooting and ball control. This camp will take place at Northgate Park for boys & girls ages 6-9. Session I is 6/12-16 & session II is 7/17-21 from 9am-12pm.

Fee: \$119

Young Rembrandts- The class for 4-5 yrs. old (9:30-10:30am) will expand on preschoolers' imagination and vocabulary as they draw familiar images such as fish, teddy bears, rainbows and cowboys. The 5-12 yrs. old (11-Noon) class will learn basic to advanced drawing skills, art techniques and vocabulary. Classes will be held at Town Hall on Tues., 6/13-7/11 (off 7/4). Fee:

Cheerleading Camp- This entry-level cheer program ensures, for 6-10yrs. old, that each camper learns cheers, proper hand and body movements and jumping techniques. This 1 week camp will be held at Pheasant Hills Park from 6/26-30 from 9am-12pm. Fee: \$119

Volleyball Camp- All aspects of the game are taught through drills and exercises that focus on passing, setting, hitting and serving. This week long camp, 6/19-23, is for 6-12 yrs. old girls & boys. This will be held at Northgate Park (grass courts) from 9am-12pm. Fee: \$119

Tee Ball- This introductory Tee Ball program for 4 & 5 year old boys & girls will emphasize instruction and teamwork. Participants

will work on catching, throwing, ground balls & running the bases. Batting will be introduced in a safe, proper and encouraging manor. This class will take place Mon & Wed from 6:15-7:15pm at Northgate Park, 6/12-7/19. Fee: \$60

<u>Soccer Buddies-</u> During this introductory soccer program, boys & girls ages 4 & 5 yrs. old will practice on skill development and teamwork. Participants should wear shin guards and gym shoes. Soccer runs 6/13-7/25 at Northgate Park. Fee: \$50

Tiny Tot Sports- This camp is geared towards the active 3 year old. During this 6 week summer camp, participants will be introduced to various sports including: soccer, basketball, tee ball, tennis and bowling. An obstacle course will be set up for the last day of class. Classes will be held at Northgate Park, 6/15-7/20, from 9:15-10:00am. Fee: \$50

Sporties for Shorties-During this six week program, participants, 4 & 5 yrs. old, will be introduced to various sports including: soccer, basketball, tee ball, tennis and bowling. An obstacle course will be set up for the last day of class. Classes will be held at Northgate Park, 6/15-7/20, from 10:15-11:00am. Fee: \$50

Kiddy Kamp-Children ages 3-5 yrs. old will be introduced to new friends, fun, sports, music, crafts, new games, songs and basic sign language. Camp runs Mon-Thurs, 6/12-7/20, from 10:30am-Noon at Elmer Miller Park. Fee: \$100

Outside Adventurers-Participant's ages 6-10 yrs. old will enjoy this time as they play new games, learn camp songs, make special crafts, and enjoy water day/s and several field trips. Camp runs Mon-Thurs, 6/12-7/20, from 12:30pm-2:30pm at Elmer Miller Park. Fee: \$115

2017 Dyer Street Reconstruction Project

This bids for the 2017 Street Reconstruction project were opened on Wednesday, May 9th. The estimated cost for the street reconstruction work on Blaney, James and Roy Streets was \$1,391,395.45. Walsh & Kelly was the low bidder at \$1,347,713.55.

Work on all streets will consist of complete street reconstruction, including spot sanitary sewer replacement and water main replacement. During construction one lane of roadway will be open to traffic at all times. Mailboxes shall be maintained and relocated as needed to allow mail delivery throughout construction. Work is scheduled to begin late May, early June. Also, as a reminder, later this summer or early fall we will have the Berens-Manaldi multiphase project designed and ready for letting.



Historical Society Speaker-Amelia Earhart

The Dyer Historical Society will be hosting speaker Jim Gibbons, historian, on **Tuesday, June 13th at 7:00 pm in the main meeting room of the Dyer Town Hall.** Jim will present the life of the woman known as "Lady Lindy," an American Aviation legend that simply vanished on her final flight. Did she drown at sea or land on an island to live the rest of her life? Was she taken captive by the Japanese and imprisoned as some claim or was she a spy for the US government? Gibbons will present the life and death, facts, and theories of America's legendary first woman aviator, Amelia Earhart.
